Our connecting flight to heaven – Purgatory:

November is the month when we step up our prayers for the souls in purgatory. Here's how the Catechism of the Catholic Church describes purgatory: "It's a state of final purification after death and before entrance into heaven for those who died in friendship with God but who need a final cleansing before being able to enter the joy of heaven." All souls in purgatory go to heaven. Purgatory is their connecting flight. So why does the church speak of those souls as poor souls? Because souls in purgatory suffer, especially because they are separated from God for whom every soul most deeply longs. They experience a pain of loss. When a person's earthly journey ends, the person meets the living, glorified Christ. But if the person's soul needs a final cleansing before moving on to heaven, the loss of its personal encounter with Christ is extremely painful. The good news is that the loss isn't permanent. The soul eventually enters into eternal heavenly glory. But since only God knows the true state of a person's soul, and since souls in purgatory are unable to pray for themselves, we pray and make sacrifices for them. What has the most powerful effect in releasing a soul from purgatory is Masses offered for the soul. No matter how certain we are that a loved one went straight to heaven, only God knows the state of a soul when a person dies, so have Masses offered for them. It's as simple as a call to our Parish Office. Your loved ones who've gone before you will be eternally grateful!


